2022-23 1st QTR MINUTES

October 30, 2022

- Jeff Tompkins opened in prayer and laid out the agenda with instruction on voting for the ministry/business report as well as the church council. Pastor Matt explained that church council members serve a three-year term, that each three-year term can be renewed once. So someone can serve for six-years, but every year in October we vote on those members.
- Pastor Matt gave an update on the joint venture with Beyond Home. The
 city of Arvada made some land available and went to Beyond Home with
 a proposal if they purchased the land, the city would give \$500,000
 towards that land with the understanding that within five years
 affordable housing would be built particularly through Beyond Home
 and their program. In order to do both the Arvada & Crossroads ventures
 there would need to be a developer. After talking with the developer,
 much discussion and prayer the decision was made not to go into a
 contract with Beyond Home for the affordable housing venture at
 Crossroads. Right now it is on pause.
- Angie updated us on the five year goals. We are in seven of twenty quarters of the five year goals.
 - Inviting neighbors we are seeing about 12 new people a week
 - Digital Engagement about 1/3 of the new guests coming are coming through one of our digital spaces.
 - Baptism Family ministry is hosting a kids and students baptism experience in January.
 - Everyone in Community Clerical error was corrected. The program is working very well and there are more people coming and getting connected.
 - Launch Churches What might it look like to build a church in Guatemala where we sponsoring a little over 150 children in this town, and partner with Compassion.
- Pastor Alex update on Fort Lupton Rebranding to 1st Street Church Fort Lupton. By July 1, 2023 they will be functioning with their own 501C3, bank account, and budget.

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The world we are living in is becoming increasingly complicated. We are in an era of history where the deconstruction of faith is at an all time high, and yet younger generations are more open to God than before the pandemic. The line between inperson and digital-church has become blurred. One-third of the American church has quietly quit. However, at Crossroads, we had 400 *more* people attend Christmas this year over last year. Strange world.

This era provides challenges, but it also opportunities to engage the Gospel in new and fresh ways. This is what we strive for as a church – to present a real and authentic reflection of Jesus for this generation. The reality is that if people can't see the church as a safe place to ask questions and raise concerns, they will look elsewhere. This is an exciting space to enter into for sure! We welcome that challenge, whether that be in our Sunday morning gatherings, community groups, serving opportunities, in our care for those in the church or loving our neighbors outside.

Shifting gears—our major undertaking this quarter was the launch of NEXT. Over the course of the year, we saw so many new people attend Crossroads. Upwards of 25% of our regular attendance are people who are new in the last two years. This led us to ask the question: What's next for them? How do we help people, whether they've been coming a long time or this is their first time, get connected?

The answer is NEXT@CROSSROADS. Developed by Pastor Trevor and Christen Brown, we defined what it means to be a part of this local church, and then created a relational experience to communicate those values. NEXT is off to a fantastic start! You'll get an opportunity to experience NEXT at the business meeting when we address the question, Why We Do What We Do?

As always, it is a joy to lead this church. I have a fantastic team who works so hard to meet the challenges of this current day. Thank you.

As we grow and welcome new guests into our community, these systems will enable us to more effectively deploy the saints into our community at Crossroads and across our city.
