NOTES	In the podcast, Matt & James touched on the tension many believers feel when they have to confront the authority of God in their lives– especially when it comes to the process of sanctification.
	How we respond to God's authority is shaped by the ways we respond to those (sometimes-flawed) humans who are in authority over us.
	Where do you land on the "Acceptance of Authority" spectrum?
	On the low end
	1 = Tell me who's in charge so I fully understand whose decisions I need to implement without question.
	On the high end
	10 = Since power always corrupts, I look at all people in authority with a sense of distrust, even disdain.
	Explain how your landing place on this spectrum expresses itself in real life.
	James used the metaphor of a baseball empire who is calling "balls & strikes" in regard to our moral decisions—which can cause some tension in our spirits when we don't like a ruling that we've done such great job justifying.
	In what sense does the Holy Spirit take on the role of an umpire in my life?
	What's your initial reaction when you disagree with one of His calls?
	How does this reaction reveal something that needs your attention?
	Matt and James make a strong distinction between justification and sanctification – and touch on the ways one impacts the other.
